The American National Standards Institute (ANSI) has just released its new standards for theatre rigging systems – **ANSI E1.47 - 2017**. Following these guidelines is a key step to ensuring that your theatre rigging equipment is working properly and safely. These new guidelines also include recommendations for the frequency of equipment inspections.

The new **ANSI Recommended Guidelines for Entertainment Rigging Systems Inspections** states that **Manually Operated Equipment and Motorized Equipment** should be inspected **ANNUALLY** or **IMMEDIATELY** after equipment or components have been newly installed, altered or repaired.

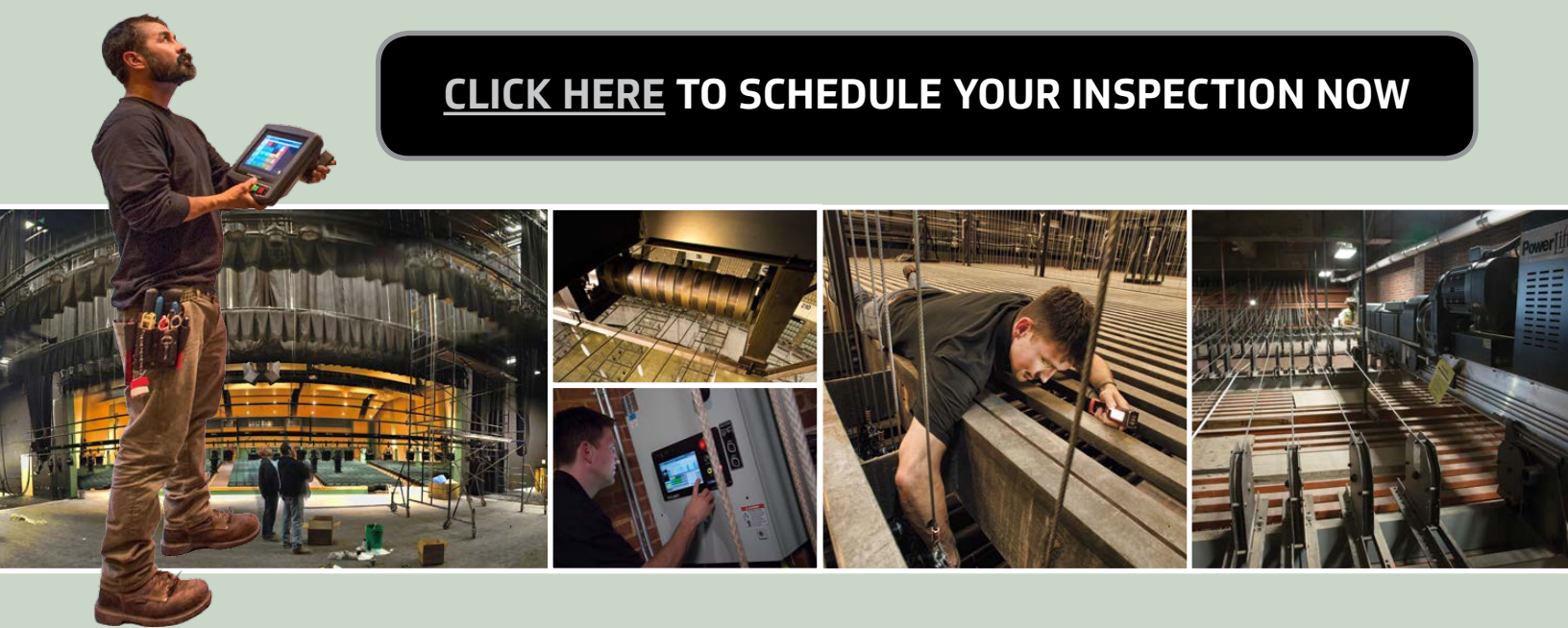
